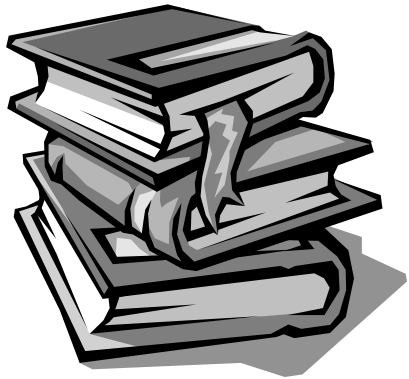


# Brain Injury: A Guide for Educators
